Dear parishioners,

February 7, 2023

On April 9th we will celebrate Easter as the day that Jesus rose from the tomb. However, there is more to celebrate than just His Resurrection. His Resurrection reveals to us eternal life in Heaven. In order to rise, Jesus had to first die. The Friday before Easter (Good Friday), Jesus offered his life as a sacrifice for the forgiveness of our sins. "No one has greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). Going back one more day, that Thursday Jesus celebrated the Passover as His Last Supper. This is the first celebration of the Eucharist. The gifts start as bread and wine but they become Jesus' own Body and Blood.

This is amazing! The Eucharist is the center of our faith as the Body and Blood of Jesus, his sacrifice, and offering of eternal life. This is so important that we have the season of Lent as a time to prepare ourselves for what we celebrate in the Easter Triduum.

It begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd with our reception of ashes signifying our desire to change. We will have extra opportunities to confess your sins during Lent. We will have a Seder Supper at St. Benedict's on Saturday, March 18th, following the 5 pm Mass honoring our Jewish ancestry. Our services celebrating the gift of God's forgiveness do not end on Easter Sunday as we continue to celebrate the Lord's mercy with a Divine Mercy Novena that concludes with a Holy Hour on April 16th at 3:00 pm. You will find the schedule

of all of these below and on the reverse side of this letter. We hope you will join us.

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

In January I began a new series of presentations titled, *The Greatest Gift: The Eucharist*. This series explains the biblical origins of our belief that the bread and wine are transubstantiated into the Body and Blood of Jesus at the Eucharist. It explains how our celebration of the Eucharist is the same sacrifice that Jesus offered on the Cross as well as Catholic practices like Adoration. Holy Hour with Adoration Each Friday of Lent from 7:00 to 8:00 pm


