Do you realize that Easter falls on March 31st this year? That means Ash Wednesday is February 14th. (Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstaining from meat so make your Valentine's Day plans accordingly!)

Lent will begin just two weeks after this letter is mailed. Have you thought about what you will do for Lent? I encourage you to give this some thought. Jesus died on the Cross for you. What are you willing to do for him? Are you going to give something up? Then, make sure you give up something important to you to make it a true sacrifice. I suggest you consider giving up a non-church activity to make some time for the Lord. If you don't come to Mass every Sunday, this would be a good time to start. If you do not normally attend daily Mass, perhaps this is the time to start, maybe one day a week or all four (daily Mass is at 8 am at St. Mary's of the Lake on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays). How about attending our Lenten Holy Hours? Would you consider attending one of my presentations (see below)?

You will find our schedule for Ash Wednesday and Fr. Jeff's presentations at the bottom of this page. On the back side of this letter, you will find the rest of our schedule for Lent and Easter through Divine Mercy Sun-

day. The Lord will be there. When will you join him?

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Two New Presentations by Fr. Jeff

Following the Second Vatican Council there was a significant falloff in both frequency of confession and Mass attendance. If you didn't go to Confession, then you didn't receive Communion. Since Vatican II many people seldom, if ever go to confession. Vatican II did not change the teaching on the frequency of confession or Mass attendance.

Fr. Jeff will be offering a presentation on Thursday, February 22nd entitled **Why Should I Go to Confession?**. On March 7th, he will offer one entitled **Why Should I Go to Mass?**. He will talk about the obligation for both confession and Mass. He will focus on **why we should want to go** to confession and Mass.


Holy Week Schedule
